Advocating for Records Access on Capitol Hill

In mid-April, I attended the third annual **Records Preservation and Access Coalition (RPAC) Hill Day** in Washington, DC, along with APG President Tricia Seguine, Past President Suzanne Hoffman, and APG Advocacy Committee Member Barb Bombaci, CG®. I represented a New York delegation, where I partnered with a representative of the New York Genealogical & Biographical Society, to attend scheduled meetings with both of our Senators' offices.

The major focus of our meetings was the National Archives and Records Administration (NARA), emphasizing how the agency supports core government functions that support not only genealogical research, but also government accountability and public access to the documentary record of the United States. We raised our perennial concerns about funding. NARA's FY 2027 congressional justification requests USD \$419.7 million in discretionary budget authority, down from the FY 2026 enacted USD \$454.264 million.

Within that, operating expenses would fall from USD \$421 million to USD \$404.842 million, and the electronic records Initiative would fall from USD \$30 million to USD \$20 million.

We stressed that cuts like these have real consequences: slower digitization, greater strain on reference services, weaker preservation capacity, and reduced access for the public. We urged Congress to protect NARA from cuts and to recognize that access to federal records is part of the basic infrastructure of a developed nation.

Hill Day gives APG the opportunity to bring that message directly to Capitol Hill, and I was proud to help ensure that genealogists' voices were part of that conversation. However, this is a team effort. Our members must similarly let their members of Congress know how important NARA is to both our history and our small businesses. Separately, APG is excited to announce that we have launched a **new Advocacy Issue Report form** to help members alert the organization to advocacy problems affecting genealogists, historians, archives, and public records access.

The form (available on the APG Advocacy homepage at <https://www.apgen.org/advocacy.php>) gives members a structured way to report issues such as closures, new fees, delays, digitization problems, privacy-based restrictions, harmful legislation, court cases, and other barriers to access, while also sharing links, documents, and information about urgency and desired outcomes. This new tool will help APG identify patterns, evaluate which issues may require monitoring or action, and respond more effectively to records-access challenges as they arise.

Your feedback can help improve access for everyone who relies on these records. You do not need to be a resident of Indiana to complete the survey.

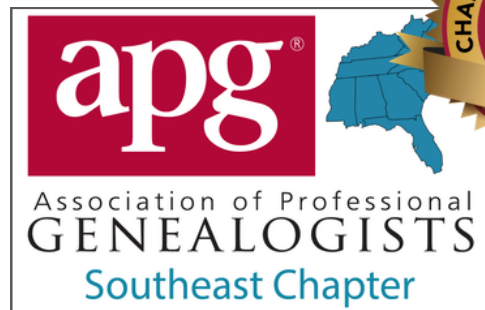
