The deadline for applications to any of these positions is 25 August 2025.

The officers are president, vice president, secretary, and treasurer. Each serves a two-year term beginning 1 January 2026. Under our bylaws, six persons will be elected to serve a two-year term at-large on the Board of Directors beginning 1 January 2026. Two persons will be elected to serve a one-year term on the Nominations Committee beginning 1 January 2026.

Nominees must be members in good standing and have joined APG before 1 August 2024 to be considered as candidates for this year's election.

Concern over Proposals to Squeeze the U.S. National Archives Budget

Rich Venezia of the Advocacy Committee highlights the latest worrying developments at NARA



More concerning news on the plight of the U.S. National Archives (NARA) this month: please review the updates to https://fundnara.com, especially on the new "NARA's Budget" tab. The Fiscal Year 2026 Budget Proposal seeks to shrink funding for Operating Expenses by more than 10 percent, which will severely limit NARA operations across the board, and impact electronic records especially hard. The Electronic Records Initiative cuts will diminish proper collection of electronic records, imperil storage and processing, and lead to record loss. NARA needs more

funding, not less, so that the agency can address critical challenges, enhance agency record-keeping oversight, improve technological capabilities, and accelerate mass digitization efforts. More funding will ensure that NARA continues to fulfill its legal obligations to preserve and care for U.S. government records into the future.

If you have not already, please contact your Members of Congress and demand that the National Archives funding remain at least at \$427.3 million. Find your member of Congress here: https://www.congress.gov/members/find-your-member.

Board Actions from July 2025


- The Board has approved updates to the nominations forms for Board nominations. The submission process will be through the website (see p.1).




Join APG at the Afro-American Historical and Genealogical Society Conference in Charleston, South Carolina
