The APG Fellowship is a funded, short-term opportunity for a professional genealogist to undertake a program focused on professional, academic, and/or personal development related to their practice. The Fellowship must be undertaken outside of the recipient's country of legal residence.

Lisa recently started her work in Italy, researching passport collections between 1850–1950 in the Genoa, Livorno, Savona, Treviso, and Turin State Archives.





In Memoriam

Gary Mokotoff (1937–2025)



It is with deep sadness that we report the passing of Gary Mokotoff, a pioneer in Jewish genealogy and a former leader of APG. Mokotoff passed away on 31 August 2025, at the age of 88. He served on the APG Board of Directors as Treasurer from 2002 to 2006 and was honored with the Grahame T. Smallwood Award in 2006 for his outstanding contributions to the organization. In recognition of his lifelong commitment to genealogy, he was named a lifetime member of APG in 2008.

Throughout his decades-long career as a researcher, author, and speaker, Mokotoff held leadership roles in numerous genealogical organizations. He was the founder and first president of the International Association of Jewish Genealogical Societies (IAJGS), which recognized his contributions by awarding him its inaugural Lifetime Achievement Award. Mokotoff also served as co-chair of the JewishGen Board of Governors and was actively involved in the Federation of Genealogical Societies (FGS), which honored him with the Rabbi Malcolm H. Stern Humanitarian Award in 2006.

Mokotoff's background in computer software development and sales played a pivotal role in his work, particularly in the co-development of the Daitch-Mokotoff Soundex System. He was also the creator of several key genealogical databases, including the JewishGen Family Finder and the Consolidated Jewish Surname Index.

As the author and publisher of Avotaynu: The International Review of Jewish Genealogy, Mokotoff contributed greatly to the field. His books include How to Document Victims and Locate Survivors of the Holocaust and Where Once We Walked: A Guide to the Jewish Communities Destroyed in the Holocaust. For many years, he lectured at genealogy conferences at the regional, national, and international levels, sharing his vast knowledge and passion for Jewish genealogy.

Mokotoff was married to his wife, Ruth, for 60 years until her passing earlier this year. He is survived by their three children, eight grandchildren, and a wide network of friends and colleagues in the genealogy community.

Forensic SIG



From Then Until Now: The Evolving Use of IGG in Law Enforcement, presented by Investigator Robert Taft. 28 October 2025, 8:00 p.m. ET (Please visit https://www.timeanddate.com for worldwide time equivalents). Doors will open at 7:30 p.m. for networking.



Investigator Robert Taft is a recently retired, 32-year member of a Southern California law enforcement agency, where he was primarily assigned to homicide and cold case investigations. His first exposure to Investigative Genetic Genealogy (IGG) began in 2018, when he was assigned to his agency's Golden State Killer Task Force. Soon after the arrest of Joseph DeAngelo, Robert began exploring the use of DNA technology to identify John and Jane Does for his department. Detective Taft initially partnered with a third-party genealogy organization, and together they successfully identified his department's first Jane Doe in December 2019. Since then, Detective Taft has continued to educate himself in IGG

techniques and became one of the few sworn law enforcement officers who conducted IGG investigations inhouse for his agency. He completed IGG certificate programs at the University of New Haven and Ramapo College of New Jersey.

Investigator Taft has received several commendations for his work and commitment to these genealogical investigations. Most recently, he was awarded his Department's Medal of Merit for his work in the investigation and identification of a 1974 John Doe, who was suspected to have been a victim of a notorious serial killer active in Southern California in the late 1970s and early 1980s.

Soon after his retirement, Investigator Taft accepted a part-time position with another regional law enforcement agency, where he continues to work on cold case and IGG investigations. He was also one of the key-note speakers at the 2025 Ramapo College Investigative Genetic Genealogy Conference this past June.
