The Fellowship must be undertaken outside of the recipient's country of legal residence. Apply today!

The Fellowship program is designed to:

- Provide opportunities for cultural immersion, expanding both professional and personal networks, experiential learning, and professional development.
- Support professional genealogists with demonstrated capacity for high-quality research and leadership.
- Promote APG as an organization of international scope that values contributions developed abroad.
- Demonstrate APG's commitment to the growth and expansion of members' experience, knowledge, and professional potential.

The winner of the 2025 Fellowship was Lisa M. Vogele, who planned to research passport collections between 1850–1950 in the Genoa, Livorno, Savona, Treviso, and Turin State Archives. The Code of Ethics serves to promote


- (1) a truthful approach to genealogy, family history, and local history;



Congratulations to former APG Board member Ricki King, who will be recognized as a 'History Maker' by the African American Museum of Iowa at its History Makers Gala on 2 October 2025 (https://blackiowa.org/events/gala/). The museum defines a History Maker as someone who "by their actions, modifies the course of history, imparting knowledge and impacting the communities in which we live," fulfilling the roles of Trailblazer, Change Agent, Legacy Maker, and Role Model within the African American community in Iowa.

Ricki is a certificate holder in Boston University's Genealogical Research program and holds a history degree. She has written for the *National Genealogical Society Quarterly*, and has presented for the Iowa History 101 Series, Iowa Genealogical Society Conference, and at local public libraries. In Spring/Summer 2021, Ricki worked with the Forever Free Pilot Mentoring Program, mentoring students researching twenty-two people buried at Woodland Cemetery in Des Moines, Iowa, and helped Woodland Cemetery become part of the National Park Service's National Underground Railroad Network to Freedom on 30 September 2021. In addition, she worked with History Quest, recording videos containing the Forever Free program's Underground Railroad research. Ricki's efforts also contributed to the opening of all Iowa death records after fifty years.
